The elder said that they were free to do what they wanted to do but he would not allow them to use the church for their Medical Mission. I've noticed that there were some problems, and then my brother went outside. Their pastor approached him to help them gather the kids. They said that they were worried that the children might not come to them. So my brother said that he would help them to gather the children. At that time the children were ready to go to school. My brother announced that there will be no class that morning because of the community service. At that time I kept asking myself, was our decision right? Then after the announcement, my brother told the children to sing their favorite song (Give Thanks). While they were singing one of the Born again member went inside the room. Then she said "Oh! I didn't know that you have a good voice, why don't you sing an action song?" Then they sang the song "I'll be riding my horse When Jesus Comes". It was a beautiful song and she liked it. She noticed some changes from the children there. She said that the last time they came in that place the children looked very dirty but now they looked neat and good. After they sang few songs my brother rendered a prayer then he said he had to go. When he went outside, the children followed him and gathered around him, pulling his shirt while saying "Sir we want to go with you". The group of Born again stared and seemed speechless. I think they wonder what we've done why the children were so at ease getting along with my brother. Maybe the reason why

they were close to us was they feel welcome in our house. After the class they go to our house and we talk just like friends. Hinugasan village is a place that is far from the town. It will take almost 15 kilometers going to the town of Paluan.
