**G**od is the only answer though the good news sending is happening gradually. There is one site here, under the territory of this Barangay is called Hawili. In this place there is no church and no believers. But after a year when I hold crusade

here there are many people accepts Christ. This place is in the mountaintop and we used to walk for two hours to reach their main site. And the problem in this place is we don't have our own church. Many people here are interested to know more about God, and their leader is asking and requesting to have their own church here, but I cant answer their request because I don't have budget for the church, I just tell them that God will answer our prayers someday, just be faithful to Him. Now the only thing that I can give is to teach them the good news and share the wonderful words of God. The only problem is after they accept Christ as their personal Savior; they don't have their own church to go to praise God especially during the Sabbath.

Almost all of the people here in the place of Hawili and Bait are Protestant and Catholic but when they heard the words of God when we conduct crusade they were confused and became interested in our doctrine. Now I am planning to conduct another crusade in this place but I don't have budget and materials to be used that's why spreading the good news prolonged here in the mountain but we

have individual teaching and sharing the gospel house to house here. But it will be easy if we have crusade, within two weeks it was done. But still I am conducting house to house Bible study, visiting people

But when they heard the truth about this they became interested and they explore more about our doctrine. Now this family is an active member of our church. Their pastor of their previous belief was trying to get them back to their church but they ignore him because they now know the truth about God. The only problem here in this place is a place enough for the church to be built because the lot here is small and near the river and many people live here. But even though this barrio is small there is still a place sold. It was 20x12m with a house but so expensive they sold it for P300000 and another one hectare that was planted by coconut trees for about P100000. It was the life here in Bait.

Here in Looc, there is a place that called BARANGAY GENEBRA. Those people living here are drunkards; they started to drink alcohol at age 14, they also smoke. But I started to be friendly to them. I have noticed that not only drinking wine, smoking cigarettes but also gambling. I have gone to a certain group of teenagers and I have noticed that one guy has wound to his big toe and causes him to walk uncomfortably. It was swelling and has pus in it. And I gave him a remedy for it through the use of activated charcoal, and praise God, the wound heals. That was the beginning of our friendship in Barangay Genebra. I share them the Love of God every time I talked to them. I made a puzzle, chessboard and checkers to divert their attention and avoid them to drink wine and gambling and to have a bonding relationship with them. Now some of the youth is my companion playing, catching fish and having Bible studies and praises God during Sabbath!

## **THE BAD PATH ALL THE WAY THROUGH SUCCESS**

We are seated in the Promised Land but the path is not good for opportunity. This is the supplication of many people here. Explanation follows!

Sister Mercedes has more or less 20 mango trees that are bearing fruits. Three of these trees were sprayed by them so that it will bear fruit. And when it bears fruit it was plenty. They bring the fruit in the town of Paluan that is almost three and half kilometers away from them, except the trip they did in the sea because their place is in between the sea and land. And they used to walk to reach the place. They carried the fruits by their shoulder that is 7000 pieces and they sell it in only P1.00 (\$about 50 cents U.S.). When they reach the town, some mango is ripe and they just give it to the people there. Many are happy for that but the only money that Sister Mercedes gained from the mango is P1800.00 (about \$36 U.S.) and they will minus the fare for the boat and fare for those people who help them to carry the mango and because of that she came back to her house deficit.

I encourage the folks there to open up road there even though the place was steep, high and mountainous. We survey the place and I thought a way how we can make it. I suggest making a zigzag road. We are almost 30 people doing this plan and some are ladies using plow, shovel and wood to dig the soil. We work simultaneously until I noticed that it was 2 o'clock in the afternoon and we feel hungry and the problem is we don't bring food, that's why I command my son Joe to look for

any kind of food around and he found guavas. We ate it altogether and we are happy doing are work. These days we are almost 90% done doing the Zigzag road in this place. Now we need 20 sacks of cement for the foundation and other materials we need constructing this road. One brethren came to me and said that many missionaries planned to do that road but nobody succeed, they said that I became the way to make their dream come true. And I said through the help of our God we will do our part to make this plan to happen. We thank God because he used me to become a blessing to the people here. Glory to our God who sustains our daily needs.

## **A BURDEN BECAUSE OF LOAN**

Brother Manuel tells his problem because being unjust. Starting June up to September, this is the time for them to have a difficult living. From the time of planting to harvesting they are forced to ask for 4 gantas of palay (rice) to somebody with the exchange of one sack of palay during harvest time. If there are times that the planted rice was destroyed you will give two sacks of planted rice for the exchange of your credit in the next harvest time. Not only that, if you will borrow for one sack of rice for you to plant, you will return it about five sacks of rice to the one who have borrowed. I have noticed that most of the rice field of minorities was in a pledge and they don't have enough money to payoff.

The rice field of our brethren here is wide. They can

harvest 700 sacks of rice every harvest time. They sell it for only P250/sack of rice (about \$5 U.S.). But the real price in other people is P420/sack of rice (about \$8.40

U.S.). That's why I encourage them to organize an organization called Cooperative. Almost 50 persons who have rice field agreed in my suggestion and they promised that they will

not sell their sacks of rice in other but they will sell it in cooperative only so that we can have our funds for the organization. This month of September we are planning to buy water pump, a machine that will separate the rice from its stem, and if God's will and we have still fund we will going to buy also hand tractor.

Once again I have proven that if there is cooperation, faithfulness, and trust in God success will come along.

Pastor Jorge just returned from a trip to Oriental Mindoro and visited Sawi, our Mangyan missionary who is working on the back side of Mt. Halcon. Sawi is the missionary who has the blind

daughter. Sawi has two helpers who have been visiting the villages around them. He has two villages specifically that he says he has been working in and

has 25 people in EACH village ready for baptism!! Bless his heart. These places are not easy to access. Sawin lives on the Oriental side of Mindoro and climbs over the back of Mt. Halcon to reach these villages.

The people in the village where Sawi lives need a church building. Some funds were left by a Canadian Mission Team after conducting a crusade in the lowland near Sawi's village. It is with these funds that they are trying to build a church. They have to go down a VERY steep

mountainside trail to the river where they can get sand for the building. At the bottom of the trail is a waterfall. The workers have to go under the water to get the sand, then haul (haul, as in on

way up the mountain. It was almost straight up. We could hardly keep our balance to walk up it was so steep. Pastor Jorge said the trail down to this waterfall is like that trail and maybe even steeper than the one we climbed!! This is very hard for the villagers to do, but they are willing to do it to build their very own church.
